

PFAS Letter US Legislation

Dear Valued Customer,

Belimo is aware of the PFAS (per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances) regulations listed below.

We are monitoring the further development of the legislations, and we are taking the necessary steps to identify components and material containing PFAS allowing us to meet the reporting duties and restrictions in due time.

We ensure that our products comply with the regulatory requirements.

PFAS in Maine

The PFAS in Products Program was initially enacted in Public Law 2021 to stop PFAS pollution. The law requires manufacturers of products with intentionally added PFAS to report the intentionally added presence of PFAS in those products to the Department beginning 1 January 2025. Effective 1 January 2030, any product containing intentionally added PFAS may not be sold in Maine. Exemptions exist.

EPA - TSCA Section 8(a)(7) Reporting and Recordkeeping Requirements for PFAS

EPA is requiring any person that manufactures (including import) or has manufactured (including imported) PFAS or PFAS-containing articles in any year since 1 January 2011 to electronically report information regarding PFAS uses, production volumes, disposal, exposures, and hazards. The reporting period shall begin one year following 13 November 2023, and last for six months: 12 November 2024, through 8 May 2025.
